#### 1. Introduction

Welcome to the Werribee Bowls Club (the Club). We sincerely hope you enjoy your bowling; be it social or Pennant, the use of our facilities or simply the social aspect of the Club.

The following information is intended to assist you to familiarise yourself with the Club. In a club our size you should expect to get to know everyone within a short period of time. Current members are encouraged to assist in making new members welcome.

#### 2. Governance

The Club's Constitution provides that the Club is governed by the Werribee Bowls Club Board of Directors, which has overall control of all activities at the Club. The Board ensures the Club is compliant with all regulatory requirements. The Bowls Chairperson and Committee are responsible for all bowls operations within the Club with the exception of selection of pennant sides. The Bowls Committee and its committee members are elected in accordance with the Constitution.

## 3. Code of Conduct

The Club has a <u>Code of Conduct Policy</u> which is displayed throughout the facility and it is essential all Members and Visitors act in accordance with this Policy.

#### 5. Around the Club

If you have not already done so, please ask a member to show you around. Make sure you see the location of the Greens Directors noticeboard, bowls notice boards, tournament board, pennant selection boards, office, location of water fountains, mats, jacks and the bowls storage area for community bowls.

Video surveillance is operational 24/7 for protection purposes.

# 6. Getting Started

- Coaching to all WBC members is provided free of charge.
- Greens are closed Monday mornings for maintenance purposes.
- On arrival please check the Green's Director's noticeboard on the right at the side entry for greens instructions.
- A "green closed" or "rink closed" sign will be placed on the green when maintenance is being undertaken or because of bad weather.
- Under no circumstances can anyone play on a closed rink or green, unless consent is given by the Greens Director.
- Community bowls are stored in the bowls shed adjacent to the undercover area. If shed is locked, the key is obtainable via the bar staff or administration.
- Greens 1 & 2 Mats and jacks are stored in the cabinet on the external wall between
   Greens 1 & 2.
- Green 3 Mats and jacks are kept in the locked cabinet on the external wall of the greenkeepers shed. A key code is required to open the cabinet and will be given to bowlers upon request.
- Grippo and similar products such as spray chalk are available for purchase from the bar.
- Club uniform is available for purchase from the club. Club uniform is compulsory for Pennant and tournament players only.
- Social bowls is played in casual clothes.

### 9. Green Fees

- Green fees are payable for all organised club games with the exception of Club Championships for which an entry fee is required
- Green fees are payable for social bowls
- No green fees are payable when practicing.

## 10. Bowling At Other Clubs

Notification of bowls tournaments are advertised on the noticeboard and are available in the Tournament Flyers folder within the club. Tournaments are also advertised on the <u>Bowls Victoria</u> website.

Club competition is encouraged for those who have made progress in learning the game and who are very keen to improve their skills.

## 11. Pennant (Midweek & Saturday)

All members are encouraged to play Pennant as it is the fastest way to improve your game. If you wish to play Pennant you will need to be an affiliated member. Have a chat to one of the selectors noted below. New bowlers are always welcome @ The Hive.

#### **Pennant Selection**

The selectors have been elected by the bowling members and, accordingly, the Club expects members to respect their decisions. If you are not happy with your selected position, it is very important for you and the Club that you speak to the respective Chairperson who will arrange a meeting to discuss your grievance at a mutually convenient time.

#### **Availability/Unavailability for Pennant**

Pennant players are expected to make themselves available each week. Should this not be the case, please notify a Selector immediately or add your name to the Unavailable list on the noticeboard as last minute changes can have a domino effect on selected teams.

#### **Pennant Duty Rinks**

Each week there is a Pennant duty rink. The rink set up only takes a few minutes. A list of duties is available on the noticeboard.



# 12. Club Championship Events

Affiliated members are encouraged to enter the Club Championship events throughout the season. These events provide a great learning opportunity and are played in a friendly manner. Enter your name on the lists as they appear on the noticeboards.

## 13. Liquor License & Smoking

**Smoking** (including e-cigarettes) is only permitted in the designated smoking areas. When any organised junior bowls event is taking place, the Department of Health effectively bans smoking around the greens (inclusive of the designated areas).

**Consumption of alcohol** is not permitted on the greens. However, responsible consumption of alcohol is permitted in moderation along the banks of the greens. No alcohol can be brought onto the premises at any time.

**Food** can be brought onto the premises. Conditions apply with indoor dining.

# 14. Volunteering

Our Club is run by volunteers of different skillsets and interests. Please look out for opportunities to volunteer and/or perhaps consider doing the small but important jobs around the Club e.g. putting out and taking in the flags, rubbish removal, gardening, cleaning, putting out or returning tables and chairs from the undercover area to the bowls shed at the conclusion of the day.

If you have a particular skill or interest, please feel free to have a chat to a Committee member to volunteer your services. A little help from everyone is all that is required to make things run smoothly for the benefit of all Members. Many hands make light work!

Before commencing a game all mobile phones, pagers and other electronic devices should be switched off for the duration of the game.

## 16. Clothing

## 17. Inappropriate Language

Inappropriate or offensive language is common today however it should not be used by patrons or bowlers out of frustration, anger, disappointment or in celebration either on or off the greens. If you notice someone who is beginning to behave in an inappropriate manner take them aside and calmly remind them of their obligation. **Bowlers are required to act in accordance with the Code of Conduct at all times.**
